SUBJECT: 26-28 Mar 04 Ground Team Member Advanced School (Part II)

1. The Central Iowa Composite Squadron will be conducting a Ground Team Member Advanced School on 26-28 March 2004 at Camp Dodge, Johnston, IA. This activity is in conjunction with the Mission Aircrew School at Camp Dodge. Sign-in for the training will begin at 1900 hours Friday the 26th at Miller Armory. Prerequisites for the courses are:

- a. Senior members must have completed Level 1 and CPPT
- b. Cadets must be at least Cadet Airmen
- c. Students must have completed the 100 Question CAPT 116
- d. Students must have a current wing-issued CAPF 101 for at least Ground Team Member
- e. Students need to have completed both the SAR School and Survival Schools in the last few years.

2. The schedule includes sign-in Friday, classroom training Friday evening, a full day of training until 2200 hours on Saturday, reconvening on Sunday at about 0700, with completion no earlier than 1600 Sunday. This school will include training in scenario development, scenario briefing, land nav, and GPS navigation. This training will give students training to be able to go back to their units and help organize quality training for their members. Participants will spend the night in the field Saturday. Students should bring proper equipment to spend the night in a field environment. The cost of the activity is \$35.00. Checks may be made out to Civil Air Patrol.

3. Participants should plan on arriving on Friday night, 26 March NLT 2000 Hours. Lodging on Camp Dodge is included in the activity cost for both Friday and Saturday nights. The activity fee will cover meals Saturday morning through Sunday lunch.

4. Uniform for this activity will be the Battle Dress Uniform (Woodland or Blue). Members are asked to bring appropriate winter outerwear for prolonged outdoor activity in March (We will be outdoors for several hours). Enclosed in this mailing is a suggested packing list. Participants who cannot compile the required equipment will still be able to participate as long as they can do so safely. Students are asked to bring the following minimum equipment to be able to participate:

- a. 24 Hour GTM Gear (Pistol belt and Canteen Minimum)
- b. Overnight Gear (Sleeping Bag, Pillow, Tent, Toiletries)

5. Pre-registration is **REQUIRED**. Students are asked to complete CAPF 31's for this activity. CAPF 31's **MUST** include the member's **SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER** so that they can be included in a

Military Support Authorization. Students do not have to include page 2 of the CAPF 31 because we do not need to know flight information. In addition, information on the student's **medical history** and **health insurance** must be completed for their own safety. Completed CAPF 31's should be mailed to Central Iowa Composite Squadron, Post Office Box 1285, Ames, IA 50014. Applications and fees are due AT the PO Box NLT 19 March 2004. Space is limited for this activity so applications will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis.
