SUBJECT: 26-28 Mar 03 Mission Aircrew School (Flying Portion)

1. The Iowa Wing will be conducting the Mission Aircrew School on 26-28 March 2004 at Ankeny Airport, Ankeny, IA. This activity is in conjunction with the GTM School at Camp Dodge. Sign-in for the training will begin at 1900 hours Friday the 26<sup>th</sup> at Miller Armory and will start at 0800 hours at Ankeny Airport on Saturday the 27<sup>th</sup>. Prerequisites for the courses are:
  - a. Senior members must have completed Level 1 and CPPT
  - b. Cadets must be at least Cadet Airmen and 18 years of age
  - c. Students must have completed the 100 Question CAPT 116
  - d. Students must have a current wing-issued CAPF 101 for at least General Emergency Services
  - e. Students need to have a CAPF 101T signed by their commanders for mission pilot, observer, or scanner in their possession if not already qualified
2. The schedule includes sign-in Friday evening, a full day of hands on training on Saturday, reconvening on Sunday at about 0800, with completion no earlier than 1600 Sunday. This training will aid in the completion of the flying portion of the aircrew tasks. The cost of the activity is \$35.00 if you wish to take advantage of the billeting on Camp Dodge. If you do not require billeting the cost is \$20.00. Checks may be made out to Civil Air Patrol.
3. This activity will be a reimbursed training mission focusing on getting new aircrew qualified. Members who have 101T's for Mission Scanner, Mission Observer, and Mission Pilot and mission staff are allowed to participate. Mission pilots who are ES evaluators are asked to attend to help train these new members.
4. Participants should plan on arriving on Friday night, 26 March NLT 2000 Hours. Individual room lodging on Camp Dodge is included in the activity cost for both Friday and Saturday nights. If you do not wish to take advantage of the billeting on either night please indicate this on your application. The activity fee will cover meals Saturday morning through Sunday lunch (except Saturday evening).
5. Uniform for this activity will be the flight suit or navy knit shirt with gray slacks. Students are also asked to bring the following minimum equipment to be able to participate:
  - a. Overnight Gear (toiletries)
  - b. Flight computer (suggested)

- c. Calculator, ruler, black or blue marker
  - d. Chicago and Omaha sectionals (need not be current but good idea)
6. Pre-registration is **REQUIRED**. Students are asked to complete CAPF 17's for this activity. CAPF 17's **MUST** include the member's **SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER** so that they can be included in a Military Support Authorization. In addition, information on the student's medical history and health insurance must be completed for their own safety. Completed CAPF 17s should be mailed to Central Iowa Composite Squadron, Post Office Box 1285, Ames, IA 50014. Applications and fees are due **AT** the PO Box **NLT** 19 March 2004.
